

## ANALYSIS

- New <u>Food Strategy Advisory Board</u> includes Food Foundation's Anna Taylor (Mandala/Fix our Food) alongside other experts, will be co-chaired by IGD and is accompanied by a cross-ministerial strategy group including DEFRA, DfE, MCHLG and DBT.
- DEFRA suspends SFI payments, with questions emerging about DEFRA farm support budgets.

## **POLITICAL INSIGHTS**

- Over 50 farming and environmental organisations have presented recommendations to the Treasury regarding DEFRA budget allocations in a joint appeal.
- DEFRA <u>paused</u> new SFI applications as the allocated budget has been fully committed. <u>New data on uptake</u>
   <u>of agri-environment business schemes</u> and <u>agricultural land use statistics</u> were also published.
- Natural England will gain compulsory purchase powers over farmland and other green spaces for nature restoration projects in new <u>Planning and Infrastructure Bill</u>.
- DEFRA has also released the first <u>UK Pesticides National Action Plan</u> in a decade.
- Children's Wellbeing & Schools Bill amendments on auto-enrolment for free school meals were withdrawn
  after Schools Minister Catherine McKinnell <u>indicated</u> DfE is exploring ways with DWP and Government Data
  Services to maximise uptake. Peter Lamb's <u>Private Members' Bill on auto-enrolment</u> was debated, then
  adjourned to 11 July.
- Parliament debated the <u>future of farming</u> on 13 March, with Norfolk MP Terry Jermy appealing against UK farming industrialization, ahead of Cranswick's proposal to redevelop pig and poultry mega farms in Methwold, which was <u>rejected</u> by the local council on 4 April.
- EFRA Committee wrote to Minister Daniel Zeichner MP about <u>supply chain fairness</u> (and has followed-up on 1 April oral session), while Alistair Carmichael MP tabled a new <u>Food Supply Chain Fairness Bill</u>.
- House of Lords debated impact of <u>Soft Drinks Industry Levy</u> and potential future regulation for healthier food environments.

## **MEDIA INSIGHTS**

- Sarah Dyke MP wrote in the <u>Farmers Guardian</u> about farmers' concerns following DEFRA's decision to close SFI applications.
- Chancellor Rachel Reeves <u>dismissed rumours</u> that DfE is considering cutting Universal Infant Free School Meals as part of budget reductions, originally reported by <u>the</u> Times.
- Barnardo's survey showed almost one in five UK parents buy unhealthy food weekly due to affordability constraints, as covered in <u>News and Star</u> and the <u>Mirror</u>.
- <u>The Big Issue</u> spotlighted School Food Matters research revealing 1 in 4 teachers personally fund pupils' meals.

## **CIVIL SOCIETY UPDATES**

- Twenty-five NGOs including Sustain and the Food Foundation published <u>joint policy briefing</u> on public procurement for health and sustainability.
- Food Farming Countryside Commission report "Paying the Price" revealed UK farmers' incomes stagnant since 1970s
- <u>Conservative Animal Welfare Foundation</u> warns factory farming undermines UK food security, threatening farmers' livelihoods and increasing import reliance.
- British Society of Soil Science launched "Soil Matters" podcast addressing critical soil health challenges.
