OVERVIEW

- The Government announces major expansion of free school meals alongside new NHS guidance on commercial baby foods, whilst the Spending Review protects environmental schemes but reduces farming budgets.
- Former military leaders call for widened national security definitions to include food systems, following Strategic Defence Review.

POLITICAL INSIGHTS

- Free school meals expansion <u>announced</u> for all children in England from households on Universal Credit starting 2026/27, benefitting 500,000+ additional children. Both England and <u>Wales</u> have launched reviews of School Food Standards. <u>Scotland</u> is piloting secondary school meal expansion for S1-S3 in 60 schools across eight local authorities from August.
- The NHS has issued <u>new guidance</u> on the use of commercial baby foods, warning parents against relying on shop-bought baby food pouches as everyday meals.
- Spending Review reduces DEFRA budgets by 2.7% annually, whilst largely protecting ELMS. Household Support
 Fund has transitioned to a multi-year Crisis & Resilience Fund, with funding of £1bn per year. NFU has <u>criticised</u> £100
 million reduction in farming and countryside programmes, including SFI and Countryside Stewardship.
- New <u>National Diet & Nutrition Survey</u> data shows children consuming double the recommended sugar levels whilst fruit, vegetable and fibre intakes all fall short.
- Former <u>military leaders</u> urge the Government to widen its definition of national security to include food, climate, water and energy, following <u>Strategic Defence Review</u>.
- Government will <u>require</u> all large food companies to report on the healthiness of their food sales by the end of parliamentary term. <u>Seven major retailers</u> plus the <u>Food and Drink Federation</u> have recently backed mandatory reporting on food health.
- Government launched <u>review</u> of the Grocery Code Adjudicator's effectiveness at ensuring fairness in supply chains.
- New <u>Consumer Council</u> research shows food shopping represents the biggest proportion of households' "basic spending" in Northern Ireland.

MEDIA INSIGHTS

- Dr. Clive Black, former Head of Food Policy at the NFU, has <u>called</u> for a Minister for the Food System.
- <u>Sir David Omand</u>, former UK intelligence chief, warns that UK governments should seek to prepare in the event of a food shock.
- Department for Health and Social Care ruled out a <u>ban</u> on alcohol advertising but said "partial restrictions are being considered" after <u>Sky TV reported</u> seeing a leaked chapter of the new 10-year Health Plan.
- Almost 200 dairy farmers have left the sector in the past 12 months, according to the latest figures from AHDB reported in <u>Farmers Weekly</u>.

- The Food Foundation <u>podcast on junk food</u> <u>advertising</u> discussed the impact of the latest Government delay in TV and online advertising restrictions.
- Sustain launched <u>Good Food Local</u>, a national benchmarking platform for councils to drive meaningful progress in food systems.
- <u>High Steaks</u> report shows young men 16-24 consume most meat and resist cutting back due to factors including protein myths and online misinformation.
