OVERVIEW

- Government launch of the 'Good Food Cycle' strategy for England aims to join up policy across 10 outcomes.
- Parliamentary focus intensifies through Health and Social Care Select Committee's new obesity inquiry, building on last year's House of Lords investigation.

POLITICAL INSIGHTS

- Government launches 'Good Food Cycle', and published the underpinnings of the <u>Food Strategy for England</u>, setting out its 10 key policy outcomes framework that the forthcoming strategy will seek to deliver to "fully realise the benefits of a healthier, more affordable, sustainable and resilient food system".
- Health and Social Care Select Committee launches new <u>parliamentary inquiry into obesity</u>, examining nutritious food access and weight management treatments, accepting evidence submissions until 28 August.
- Secondary legislation to exempt brand advertising from less healthy marketing rules was published with a 3 week consultation, and <u>debated in the House of Lords</u>.
- Government published the <u>English Devolution and Community Empowerment Bill</u>. LGA has <u>this helpful summary</u>. Dr Christopher Yap has this useful slide deck on <u>devolution and food systems change</u>.
- <u>Capital Grants</u> scheme receives £150 million funding boost for farmers implementing SFI actions, with applications reopened since 3 July 2025.
- SFI scheme <u>offers</u> limited second chance applications for specific 'exception groups', including farmers reporting issues with Rural Payments Agency system, and with unfinished applications between 12 January-11 March 2025.
- NFU leads a consortium <u>calling</u> for improved school food and farming education quality, including enhanced soil functions, threats and management teaching.
- A new <u>report</u> following an inquiry into nitrogen use by the Environment and Climate Change Committee recommends a holistic nitrogen strategy within two years.
